

Living in Fernbourne Road is very different to a normal suburban street.

Although only 2 mins walk from the Wellington Point Railway Station with direct access to the city, it is like living in a little piece of country.

The road is a cul de sac that has recently been formally closed to traffic at the northern end. It is now only accessible on foot but leads down to Hilliard's Creek with direct small boating access to Moreton Bay.

The trip to the bay is through overhanging mangroves until the creek opens into wider water areas. It is a great kayaking trip or small tinny. The land here has been recently acquired by the Redland City Council as a nature reserve and will not be built on.

Every year in October, the street is lined with Jacaranda blossoms. Because it is so pretty, bridal parties and others come down for photographs. At other times of the year it is always green, stunningly beautiful and peaceful.

It is a great place for walking with access to walking tracks alongside the Geoff Skinner Reserve, past bird hides and leading down to Wellington Point. The street is also part of the Moreton Bay Cycle Path with access across a foot bridge to Ormiston which is also an easy walk amongst beautiful trees.

Because of all the natural greenery and focus on native plants, there are many types of wildlife to be found. We have wallabies, koalas and many different types of birds that frequent this area.

There is easy access to shops, doctors, specialists and sporting facilities.
